



Other Graduation Requirements

- Graduation Pathways in ELA and Math
 - typically met through the SBA
- Washington State History
 - Normally completed in Middle School
 - If you did not complete it in middle school, you will need to do so before graduating
- High School and Beyond Plan
 - This is a project that you will work on during advisory/homeroom
 - Helps you to think about your goals after high school and what you can do now to achieve them

Washington State Public University Entrance Requirements

Credits	Content Area
4.0	English
3.0	Social Studies
3.0	Math – minimum of 3 credits through Alg 3-4. Senior quantitative math course required (Completion of PreCalculus before the senior meets this requirement)
2.0	Science - 1.0 credit must be in an algebra-based laboratory science course. The other credit must be in biology, chemistry, or physics (this course may also meet the algebra-based requirement)
2.0	World Language (2 years same language)
1.0	Fine, Visual or Performing Arts - or 1.0 additional credit from any academic area above - UW and WWU require 0.5 Fine, Visual or Performing Arts




